

# 2025 VA Disability Pay Chart for TDIU

<b>Veteran alone</b>	<b>\$3,831.30</b>
<b>With spouse</b>	<b>\$4,044.91</b>
<b>With spouse and 1 parent</b>	<b>\$4,216.35</b>

<b>With 1 parent</b>	<b>\$4,002.74</b>
<b>With 2 parents</b>	<b>\$4,174.18</b>

Total disability based on individual unemployability (TDIU) is a type of VA disability rating that pays at the same monthly rate as 100%. It is granted to veterans with conditions that don't add up to 100% but are severe enough that they are unable to work.

## How does a veteran qualify for TDIU?

- You must have at least one service-connected disability rated at least at 60%, OR two or more service-connected disabilities with at least one disability ratable at 40% or more with a combined rating of 70% or more.
- You must be unable to maintain substantially gainful employment as a result of service-connected disabilities (marginal employment, such as odd jobs, is not considered substantial gainful employment for VA purposes).
- You must not have been discharged dishonorably.
